2. MINUTES\NOTES OF AGM HELD IN 2009:- (AA)

3. SECRETARY'S REPORT: - (AA)

- <u>REGISTRATION PROCEDURE STILL POOR AND PEOPLE NOT RESPONDING ON TIME.</u> LOOK AT CHART - NUMBER OF RED CELLS HAS DECLINED BY AND AVERAGE OF SEVEN ON LAST 3 YEARS.

- WE HAVE BEEN RANGING BETWEEN 60% / 65% OF MEMBERS CATEGORISED AS BELOW 18.
- BIGGEST IMPROVER OF THE YEAR IS ASH T, WHO HAD IT NOT BEEN FOR SOME DISQUALIFICATIONS, WOULD HAVE PERFORMED MUCH BETTER ON THE GOY.
- BEST AVG SCORE OF THE YEAR, WAS BY ASH T. WITH 34, CLOSELY FOLLOWED BY SHREYA AND NISH WITH 33. TO PUT THIS IN CONTEXT, THE AVG POINTS FOR THE SOCIETY WAS 26 FOR THE YEAR.
- DESPITE ALL OF THE MOANING ON PLAYING FROM WHITE TEE'S, AS AN AVERAGE, THE SOCIETY HAS IMPROVED BY ALMOST 0.4 HANDICAP
- As HANDICAP SECRETARY, THE YEAR WAS BLIGHTED BY 2 MEMBERS WHO CHOSE TO REVEAL HIGHER HANDICAPS IN ORDER TO AVOID REVEALING THEIR TRUE PLAYING HANDICAPS.
 I WOULD LIKE TO STRESS THAT INTEGRITY IS ONE OF THE VIRTUES EXPECTED OF GOLFERS OF ANY ABILITY, AND IS A KEY FOR US TO CONTINUE PLAYING WITH THE FAIRNESS THAT AS A SOCIETY WE HAVE WORKED HARD TO DEVELOP SINCE OUR BEGINNING.
- WE HAD 8 MEMBERS WHO DID NOT PARTICIPATE IN ANY EVENTS THROUGH THE YEAR, ONLY 2 OF WHICH ARE CLASSIFIED AS "COUNTRY" MEMBERS. FROM A HANDICAP CONTINUITY THIS MIGHT BE SOMETHING THAT WILL NEED TO BE ADDRESSES AT SOME POINT.

5. SOCIAL COMMITTEE'S REPORT (SOC COMM)

EVENT 1 - PAPAJI'S

- 35 ATTENDEE'S (30 MEAT AND 5 VEG)
- GENERAL FEEDBACK WAS VERY GOOD VENUE, LOCAL AND GOOD FOOD.
- FEEDBACK WE ONLY RECEIVED FEEDBACK FROM 12 PEOPLE.

EVENT 5 - RAW LASEN

- 30 ATTENDEE'S (25 MEAT AND 5 VEG)

- GENERAL FEEDBACK - GOOD VENUE BUT NOT ACCOMMODATING AND SLOW SERVICE. NOT FLEXIBLE AND WOULD CHARGE FOR ANY ADDITIONAL SERVICES.

- NO FEEDBACK REQUESTED BY SOC COMM. GENERALLY, EVERYONE HAD A GOOD MEAL AT THE GOLF COURSE AND WERE NOT HUNGRY.

- KESH AND I WERE THERE FROM THE SOC COMM TEAM AND OUR THOUGHT WAS GOOD FOOD BUT VENUE NOT ACCOMMODATING WITH CHANGES.

IRC - BLUE GINGER

- GOOD FOOD, LOCAL, NO COMMENTS AS EVERYONE WAS EITHER TOO PISSED OR JUST ENJOYING THE DAY.

6. TREASURER'S REPORT: - (RG)

THE AVERAGE ATTENDANCE IN 2009 WAS 28. WE HAD A TOTAL NUMBER OF 191 MEMBERS AND 9 GUESTS ATTENDING THE 7 GOY QUALIFYING EVENTS.

We made a loss of £556.00 for the 9 events (7 Events+IRC+ISCC) hosted in 2009. This loss includes a payment of £450.00 (£30.00 per head subsidy) that is paid for members representing the Society at the Annual ISCC tournament.

The average cost per event was $\pounds 71.68$.

The sundry income in 2009 was \pounds 1,832.54. This comprised of the following items.

The overall P/L for 2009 was a profit of \pounds 741.32. The closing bank balance for 2009 was \pounds 10,266.87. This sum includes \pounds 170 which belongs to the PGS Social Committee, and \pounds 74.13 payable to a charity for profit made in 2009.

POINTS OF NOTE:

SACHIN STILL OWES HIS ATTENDANCE FEES FOR THE ISCC £55.00. HE HAS BEEN SENT SEVERAL REMINDERS.

There was a deposit of $\pounds 100.00$ paid to Lamerwood which is being held in reserve for PGS for any event which we chose to host during 2010.

A PAYMENT OF \pounds 74.13 WILL BE MADE TO A CHARITY RECOMMENDED BY THE MEMBERS.

7. CHANGES \ UPDATES TO CONSTITUTION & EXISTING RULES: - (PGS COMM)

<u>2004</u>

- PLAYERS SHOULD BE DRESSED APPROPRIATELY ON AND OFF THE COURSE. EVENING ATTIRE WILL BE TROUSERS OR CHINOS, SHIRT OR GOLF ASSOCIATED TOP; FAILURE WILL RESULT IN A £20.00 FINE.
